### EFIMED ANNUAL MEETING in ORVIETO (Italy)

The 2<sup>nd</sup> EFIMED business meeting was held on September 17<sup>th</sup> within the framework of the EFI Conference week. We counted with sixty participants from 20 countries, not only Mediterranean ones but also interested representatives from Central and Northern Europe.

One of the main issues discussed during the EFIMED progress meeting was the need to develop a common vision on the scientific challenges and research priorities for Mediterranean forests through a **Mediterranean forest research agenda (MFRA)**. EFIMED will take the lead in coordinating such initiative with the support of its network and relevant stakeholders in the region.



### EFIMED takes seriously the gender issue!

EFIMED co-organised the Session on “*Ecosystem services and tourism*” of the EFI annual conference Scientific Seminar. Many Mediterranean colleagues presented their work results on *Valuation of externalities and new tools for sustainable tourism development*, e.g., from Italian innovative initiatives to market new forest services to an overview of rural tourism potential in Albania. Participants could compare and discuss economic valuation studies for different Mediterranean sub-regions: e.g. Northern Greece, Central Spain, Israel; as well as different experiences on Payment for Ecosystem Services. The

active participation of our Mediterranean female researchers was remarkable, since all speakers were women.

### Living with forest fires

A dialogue session on Forest fires was organized by EFIMED and PHOENIX during the EFI annual conference. Such event gave the participants the opportunity to discuss about the different structural causes of fires in North-South of the Mediterranean rim, as well as which are the key strategic actions to minimize such risk in the region.

EFIMED is nowadays finalizing a Discussion paper on **Living with wildfires: what science can tell us? A contribution to the Science-Policy dialogue**.

### EFIMED COOPERATES IN IUCN CONGRESS

The International Union for the Conservation of Nature held this year its World Congress in Barcelona. Dr. Marc Palahí was invited to participate in the debate on “*Mediterranean Forests: Adapting to Global Change*”.

IUCN Mediterranean programme and EFIMED agreed to establish strong links in future initiatives related to Adaptive management models for Mediterranean forests as well as in future Higher education activities.

*Mediterranean forestry*". A second seminar will take place in Montpellier on research transfer. They are intended to be a stage on the way of the Foresterranée Conference.

Foresterranée is organized by the Association at the end of November 2008, entitled: "*An objective to share between practitioners and researchers: the sustainable production of goods and services in Mediterranean forest*"

Dr. Birot chaired the discussions and introduced the participants the preparation of a Mediterranean Research agenda by EFIMED, highlighting its main research priorities.

## LAUNCH of the MEDITERRANEAN FORESTRY DATABASE

In the frame of the MEDFOREX project an inventory was conducted with the objective of estimating the Total Economic Value of Mediterranean forests. The inventory compiled data on direct and indirect use values as well as different non-use values, for 18 countries in the Mediterranean basin.

The EFIMED database resumes the data on the state of the forest, quantity and value of wood and non-wood forest goods and services collected by the MEDFOREX inventory and also presented in the book *Valuing Mediterranean Forests* (eds. Merlo M. & Croitoru L.).
